We held consultation events at:

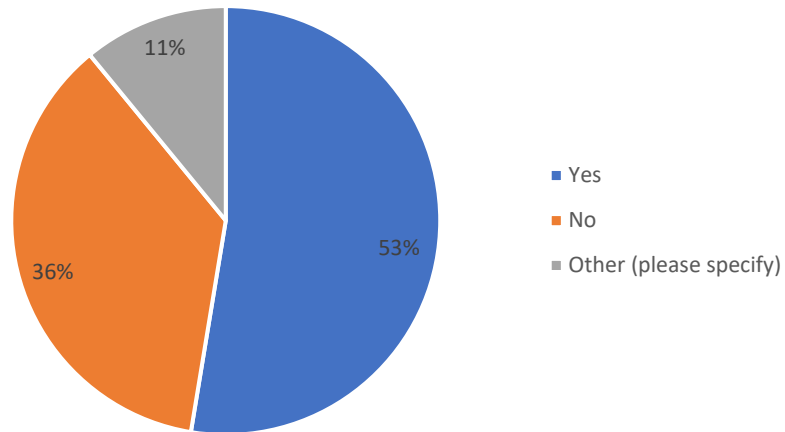
- The Annual Town Assembly - 25/04/22

Over **180** people participated in this survey – these are the results....

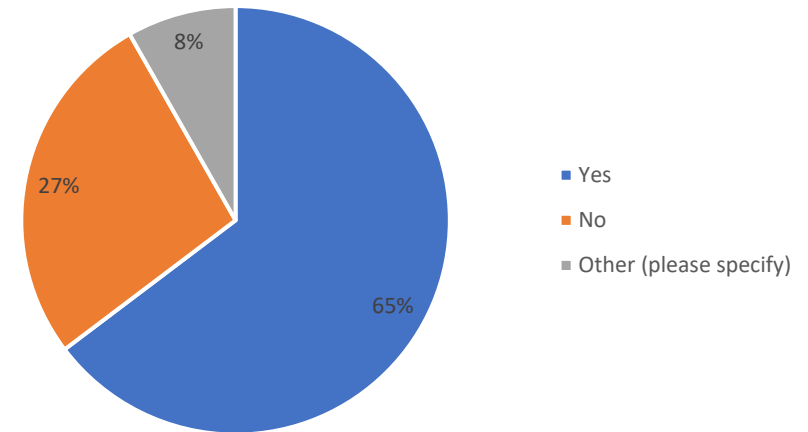


Theme : Speeding

Q1. To reduce speeding from Canonbury Street and Marybrook Street into Market Place we propose narrowing the roads in and around the Market Place. Would you support this?



Q2. To reduce the speed of traffic coming out of Marybrook Street and into the Market Place we propose making sharper the corner by the former bank. Would you support this?

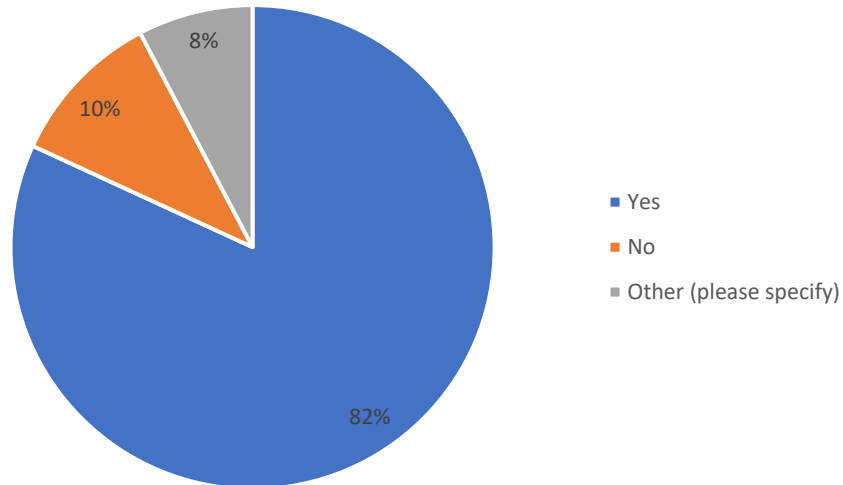


We will look to reduce speeding and changing the road layout to support this

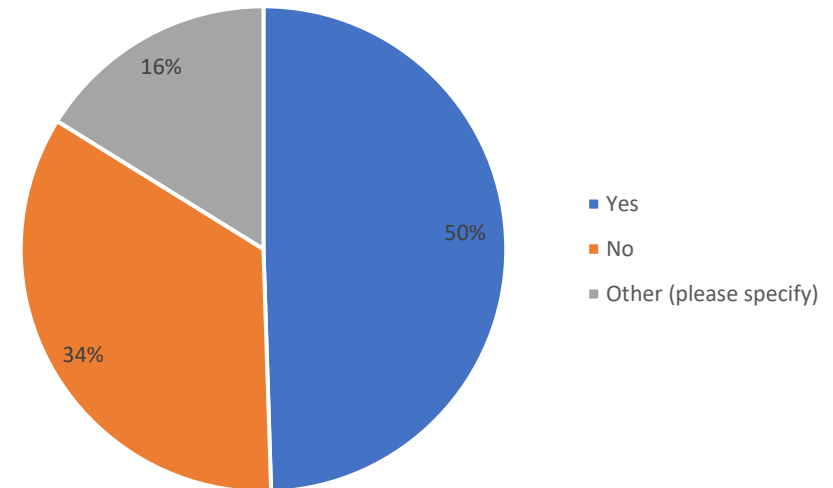


Theme : Accessibility

Q5. Do you support the installation of electric charging points in the Town Centre?

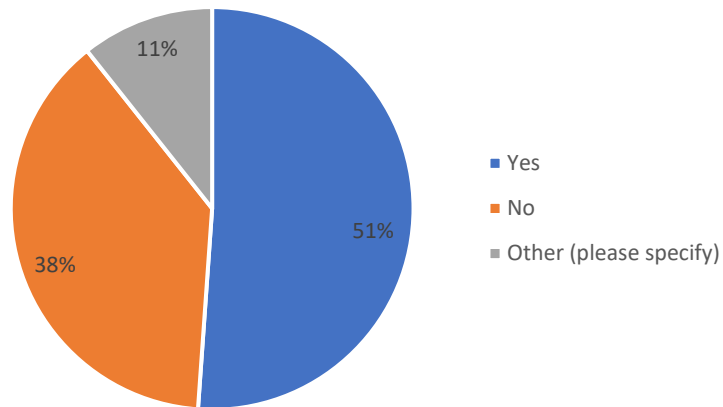


We will look to improve accessibility and install electric charge points

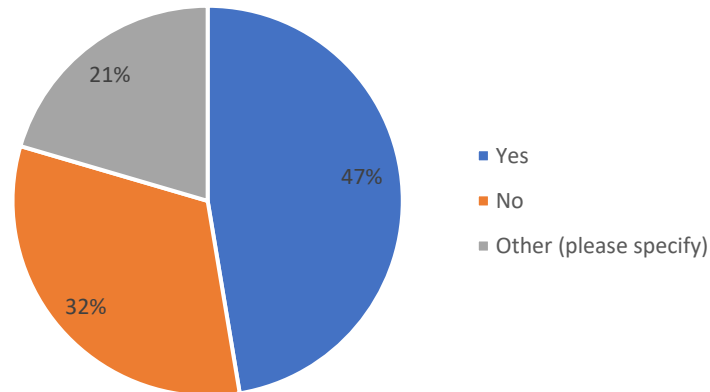


Theme : Parking

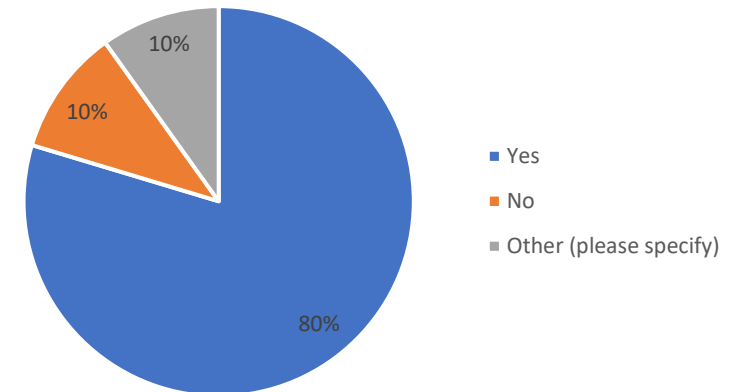
Q6. Do you think parking restrictions should be changed to favour more residents parking outside of 9am – 5pm?

Q8. The current scheme has tried to retain the existing amount of parking. Would you be in favour of further future schemes to look to increase parking elsewhere in the Town?

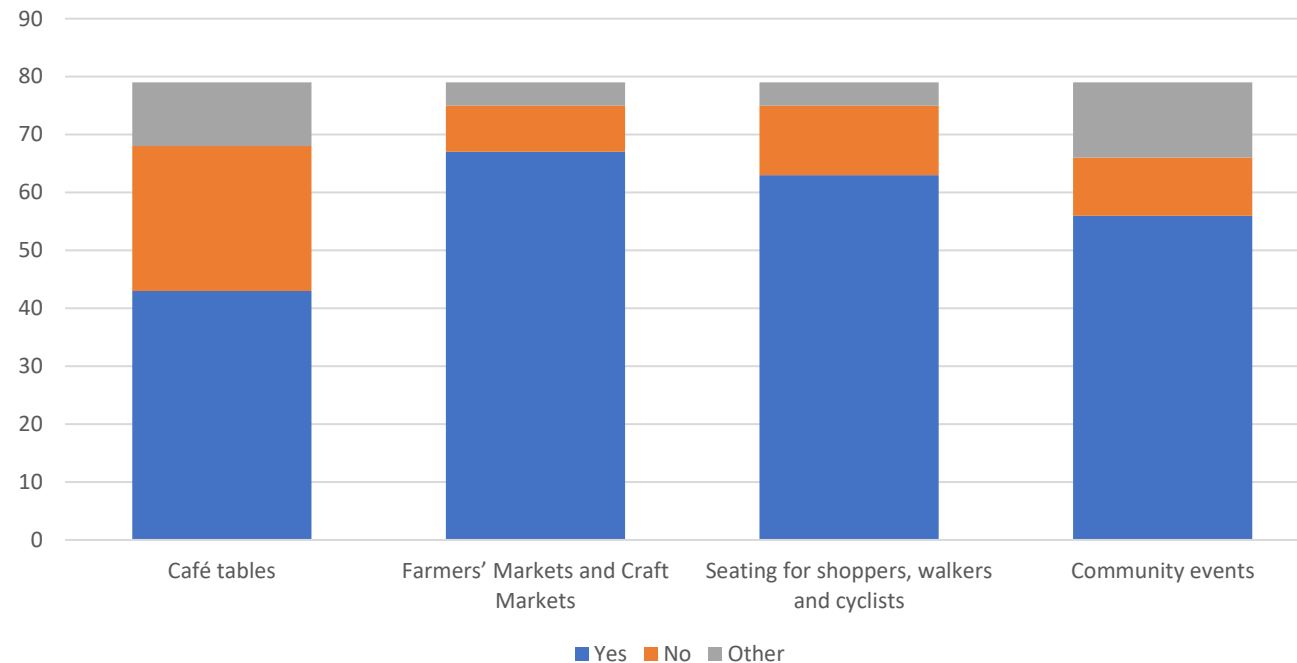


We will look to retain the parking and ensure restrictions are changed to favour residents

Q10. The speeding measures mentioned above could create a small public space without reducing parking spaces. What would you like to see this space used for?

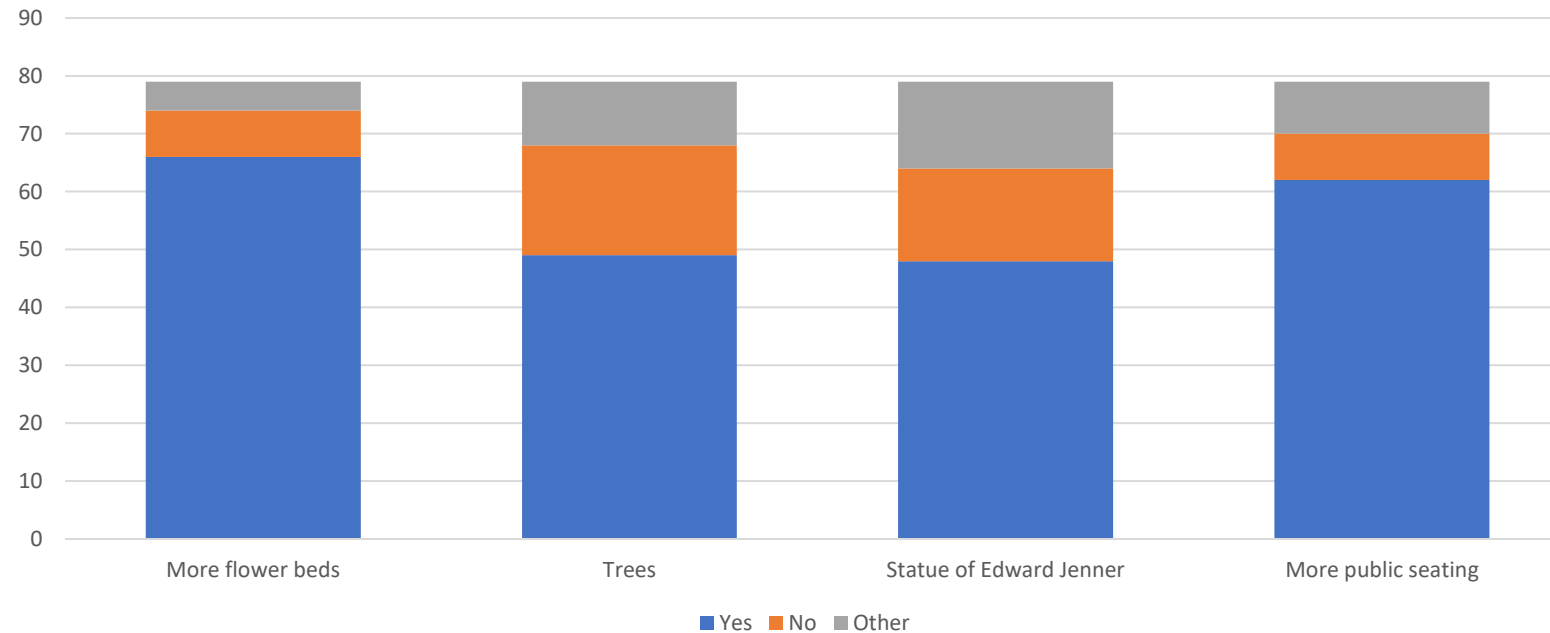


We will look to incorporate café tables, farmers markets, seating and community events in the designs

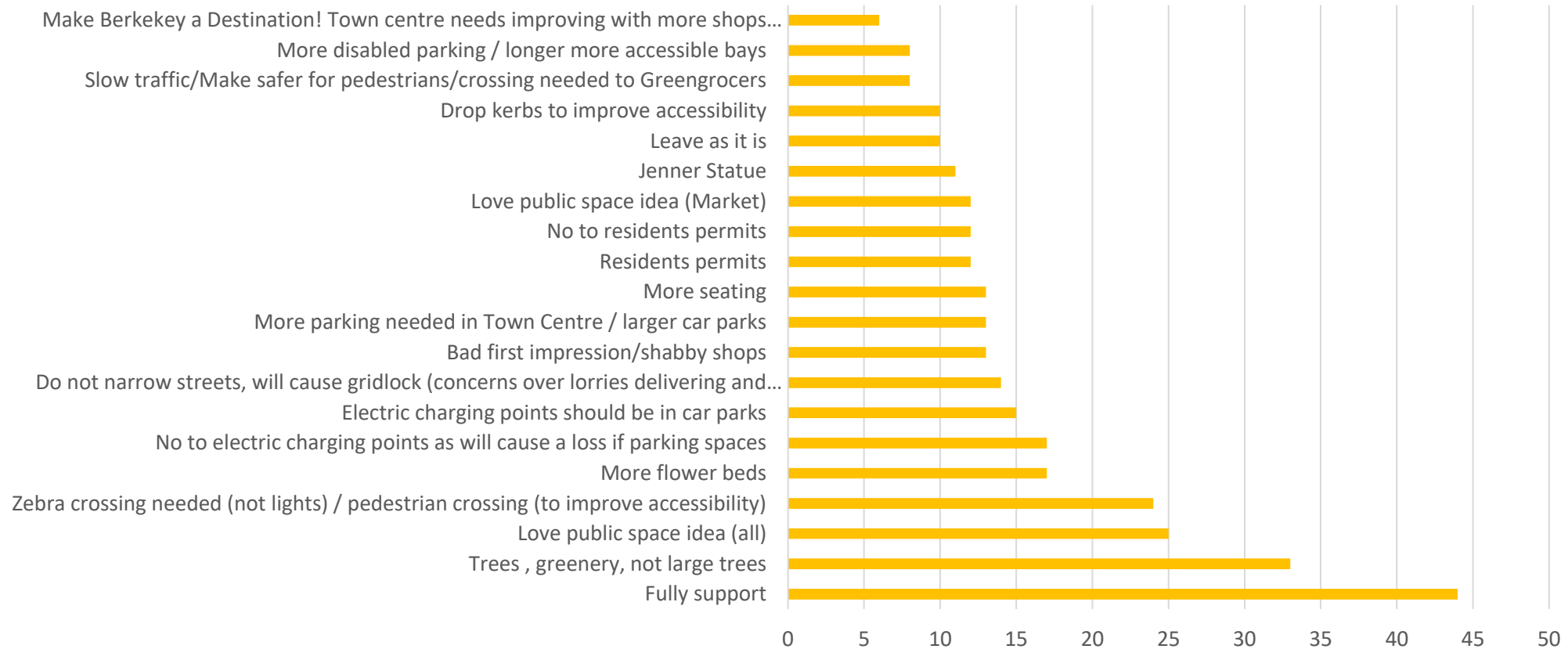


We will look to incorporate more flower beds, trees, seating and a statue of Edward Jenner
